While the fundamental best practices for managing the Schedule of Classes remain the same, as outlined the [UAccess Student: Managing the Schedule of Classes training](#) (offered in Edge Learning), the training content will be updated and published in alignment with the project webinar to reflect the new user experience and features.

Room Scheduling Software Version Update May 16

To enhance system security and enable future improvements, the room scheduling software, Ad Astra, is receiving a version upgrade. Without changing the current user experience, this update introduces support for future implementation of single sign-on (SSO) and lays the groundwork for long-term enhancements. The update is scheduled for the morning of May 16, after final exams and before the start of summer sessions, to minimize disruption as most campus activity will be centered on commencement.

MANAGING THE SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Winter 2025 & Spring 2026 Open Scheduling Underway

Open Scheduling in UAccess began on **May 5 and continues through July 31**. The winter 2024 and spring 2025 terms were "rolled over" to create the winter 2025 and spring 2026 terms on April 28. Open Scheduling is the first opportunity for department schedulers to cancel, add, or change class sections to be delivered differently than in the past.

Department schedulers need to take action to implement changes to:

- Meeting patterns: update Days and Times
- Facility ID: Specific Department Facility ID- Departmentally Scheduled Classroom (999-TBA if unknown) or 999-RMRQST – Centrally Scheduled Classroom
- Room characteristics: 31 – Departmentally Scheduled Classroom or 32 – Centrally Scheduled Classroom
- Requested Room Capacity & Enrollment Capacity: Update based on historical enrollments.
- Combined Sections: Ensure sections being taught simultaneously are combined in the Schedule of Classes.

SCHEDULING TIP

Requesting a Collaborative Learning Space

With winter 2025 and spring 2026 open scheduling underway and the start of summer right around the corner, now is the perfect time to connect with instructors, before they are gone for the summer to confirm their class layout needs and options. **Collaborative Learning Spaces (CLS)** are reimagined classrooms that support a model of active learning by providing flexible furniture arrangements, multiple screens, tabletop whiteboards, augmented acoustics, and enhanced networks to encourage the use of technology.

There are 52 CLS rooms and each semester the demand for a CLS grows. If there are multiple requests for a specific CLS at a certain time, the RCS team works with the department schedulers to find a solution. It is best to have already discussed options with your instructors before rooms are scheduled. For example, is the instructor's priority to have the CLS even if it is outside of prime-time hours, or do they value the meeting pattern and time over the CLS format? As the department scheduler, it is important to know the options available and how to guide faculty in accessing these instructional resources.

Instructors are responsible for submitting and maintaining their applications to qualify for the CLS **Preferred Instructor list**. Instructor eligibility will be verified before a CLS is assigned. Department Schedulers who need to confirm active CLS Preferred Instructors for their department can contact rcshelp@arizona.edu to check if an instructor is approved.
